1. Prayer is not meant to be an aimless, sporadic experience but a way of life with powerful results. (Mark 11:22-24; 1 John 5:14-15)

- A. Intense prayer. (Lamentations 2:19)
- B. Persevering prayer. (Luke 11:5-10)
- C. Trusting prayer. (Luke 11:11-13)
- D. Honest prayer. (Psalm 51:1-12)

## 3. Basic Principles of Prayer

- A. Prayer is a dialogue based upon our relationship with God. (Exodus 33:12-14)
- B. Prayer is a testing of our faith. (Hebrews 11:6)
- C. Through prayer we obtain the fullness of the Holy Spirit. (Luke 11:13)
- D. Prayer involves people in God's purposes. (Matthew 9:37-38)
  - When God wants to do something in the earth, He sets His people praying. J.W. Orr
- E. Through prayer we overcome the devil. (Ephesians 6:10-18)
- F. Prayer keeps us from temptation. (Matthew 26:41)
- G. God does great things through prayer. (Mark 11:22-24)

## 4. Hindrance to Answered Prayer

- 5. **Five Areas of Christ's Prayer Pattern** Jesus taught a powerful pattern to prayer with dynamic, supernatural results that touches every area of human need in Matthew 6:9-13. One and a half years later the disciples asked Him to teach them to pray (Luke 11:1-4) and He brought them *back* to the pattern He taught earlier.
  - A. PRAISE Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your Name....
    - Begin by praising Him for who He is using His Old Testament Names. (Exodus 3:13-15; Part 2 Knowing Him)
  - B. PRIORITIES Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
    - As our Savior, He is also our Lord, Master and King and we are His people with all the responsibilities and benefits.
    - Bring everything in our lives under His authority (Matthew 6:33) and pray that His Will be done in my life and my family, in our church, in the United States and in the world.
  - C. PROVISION Give us today our daily bread.
    - If we seek first His Kingdom, the Lord *will* provide what we need. (Matthew 6:28-34; Malachi 3:10-12)
    - Be in the will of God concerning my finances, pray for physical, emotional and spiritual needs.
    - Pray for a hunger for the bread of God's Word.
  - D. PARDON Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.
    - God cannot forgive me if I do not forgive others. (Matthew 6:14) Therefore, I release them and receive God's forgiveness for my sins. (Psalm 32:5; 1 John 1:8-9)
    - Before I begin the day, I choose to forgive those who may offend me today.
  - E. POWER And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.
    - Ask God to purify and cleanse me from secret sin where Satan may have a hold. (Psalm 19:12-13; John 14:30; 1 John 1:9)
    - Pray for the fullness of the Holy Spirit and put on the full armor of God. (Ephesians 6:10-18)
    - Pray for revival in the church and a harvest of souls to come into the Kingdom of God. (Hosea 6:2-3; Matthew 9:36-38)
  - F. Now return to praise and boldly declare His love and His promises. (Psalm 89:2)
