HOPI (Northern Arizona)

Due to Covid limitations and restrictions, the Hopi tribe is eliminating parts of the Library. We've been involved with Dinah and the mobile library for several years and are continuing to help her establish the first library for Hopi children, youth and adults.



We've provided finances to deep clean and paint the room. We are now planning a trip to work on the library to do minor

construction, install library shelves, and begin the process of



having an online presence for the library. Dinah is a believer and she's extremely grateful for all our help!

JEMEZ (New Mexico)

Because of generous gifts, a special family in the Jemez Pueblo has built a much needed piki house. Many women have a piki stone and make their own piki but the younger women need to be taught this important tradition.

The Piki house has two rooms. One room will be dedicated to preserving old piki stones and artifacts as well as a place to demonstrate traditional pottery making. The other room will be used to teach and make piki bread.



This is a dream come true for one of the village's 94 year old matriarch. This will be used also for cultural preservation classes.

Now the Piki House is nearing completion through teamwork: we've raised the money and they've provided all the labor!

YUSHU (Qinghai, China)

Even though the Tibet Autonomous Region of China (where we have visited seven times!) is closed indefinitely to non-Chinese travelers, we are still blessing Tibetans.

Yushu Tibetan Autonomous
Prefecture is in Southern Qinghai
Province, China. There are around
400,000 people, predominantly
Buddhist, in the metropolitan area in
2020. Almost the entire area of Yushu
Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture is
nomadic pastureland. It is one of the
oldest towns in Qinghai Province and
it is a trade hub for Ya'an, Xining, and
Lhasa.

2 years ago I (Pastor Jack) was contacted by a Tibetan leader in Yushu requesting a LifeStraw

Community Water Filter for a Tibetan village. Their water supply was dangerous because of parasites and pollution. On one of our journeys to Lhasa, we brought a LifeStraw Community Filter to Beijing and transferred it to a friend who took it to Yushu. They were ecstatic! It really did the job!

We have another invitation to go to other Tibetan villages in the Yushu area with Community Filters and LuminAID solar lights. We're looking at the end of the year when it may be easier to fly







into China. Through our friend, Fiona in Lhasa, they heard about our work with Native Americans and wanted me to share with them about the natives' ability to live under a dominant culture.



DHARAMSALA (Himachal Pradesh, India)

We are still planning to print the new Tibetan Bible. However, due to India's current condition, the country is closed, giving Lobsang and Kunsang time to review the translation to make sure it is correct in every way.

Approximately \$20,000 has been received for the printing of the Bible. We also have Foursquare Missions Press ready to help.

Through RestoringTouch we are sending Yeshi and Tibet World, an organization that receives Tibetan refugees, a special financial gift. In the past we have supported him with an



annual salary for an English teacher. Covid in India has made it impossible to stay open even though the needs are escalating.
