1. **Why should I pray the Disciples' Prayer Pattern?** (The "Lord's Prayer," Matthew 6:5-15; Luke 11:1-13)



A. It addresses every life issue and need.

- *Our Father* speaks of our relationship with God.
- *In Heaven* reminds us of His glorious Throne and Sovereignty.
- Hallowed be Your Name leads us to praise Him for who He is. Click the QR code to see a list of God's Names.



- Your Kingdom come causes us to put first things first.
- Your will be done on earth as it is in Heaven releases everything to His control and Divine order.
- Give us this day our daily bread reminds us that He is our physical and spiritual life source as we are consistent to obey His principles.
- *And forgive us our debts* reminds us of our sins and His solution.
- *As we forgive our debtors* keeps us free from unforgiveness.
- And do not lead us into temptation causes us to understand that temptations are real and that we must not give the devil any foothold in our hearts/lives.
- But deliver us from the evil one places us in an overcoming position through Jesus Christ.
- For Yours is the Kingdom and the Power and the Glory forever brings us back to praise, His divine ownership, ability and abiding presence.

2. What are a few of the characteristics of powerful prayer?

James 5:16 The heartfelt and persistent prayer of a righteous believer can accomplish much when put into action and made effective by God — it is dynamic and can have tremendous power. AMP

- B. As a regular part of our daily activities. We will have to exchange activities and build new habits. (Ephesians 5:15)
